BOWLING: Bowling Chairman, SIR Frank Semans reported a very active and enjoyable year for the bowling league. The SIR Bowling League was divided into 4 Divisions of 8 teams (4 men each) for a total of 128 bowlers. Branch 23 had 4 teams 6 Alley Oops, Groovers, Dream Team, and F.O.F.

Donn Staffordøs former team, the Groovers, had a great season, finishing 1st in their Division with an 86-38 record (the Leagueøs best) and 2nd for the League Championship. The Groovers also received a Team award for High Scratch Series in Division 3. The Grooverøs team members were: Joe Rodriguez, Ron Jesperson, Frank Semans, and Frank Yeater.

Frank Semans received League awards for Most Improved Average, most games shooting 70+ above average (12), High Handicap Series (771), and Bowler of the year for 55-72 Age Group. Joe Rodriguez received a League award for High Handicap Series (740) for 55- 73 Age Group.

The SIR Bowling League is open to all SIR members 55 or older and is always looking for new bowlers. We bowl once a week at Country Club Lanes from September to April.

GOLF:

General: Our branch participates with two separate groups; an 18-hole and a 9-hole group. All members are allowed to play in either or both groups. Tournaments are scheduled so there is no conflict of tournament dates.

9 Hole League: The chairman and statistician is Ed Campini, and the tournament director is Jim Otto. The 9 hole league is made possible by the assistance of Dick Oxford, treasurer, Jim LaBarge, assistant tournament director, and Bill Sutherland,

Significant Events: The following events occurred during the year that are worthy of discussion.

Annual Budget: At the end of 2007, it was noted that our financial reserve was continuing to go down to the extent that we should reevaluate our revenue and expense situation in more detail. A decision was made at that time to not offer a free lunch in 2008 to improve the expense side, and that we should consider doing a formal budget to allow better visibility of our financial situation. In January, 2008, the board of directors took on the task of creating an annual budget. Treasurer SIR Fritz Walgenbach started the process by doing a detail review of the last 8 years of financial records to identify the history of our revenue and expenses in detail categories. This outstanding effort allowed the creation of a budget document that makes it very clear where our money comes from and how it is going to be spent. This process will continue into 2009 and beyond, and will ensure that we can anticipate any potential shortfalls, and take appropriate action in a timely manner. The first budget was approved in April 2008. During the process, it

became apparent that our lunch receipts were not covering the cost of the necessary extra lunches and gratuities, and the Executive Board made a decision in Feb, 2008 to increase our lunch cost by \$1, to \$13 per person.

Honorary Lifetime Membership: In December 2007, Branch 23 lost one of its four Honorary Lifetime Members with the passing of King Heaslet. As we still had sufficient membership to allow his replacement, the board of directors initiated a review process to nominate a new Honorary Lifetime Member. The overall nomination process was a bit unclear, as our branch had not had a new HLM for several years. They included 12 members as candidates, with six being qualified based on the state criteria as they understood them. The final nomination package was submitted in June, 2008. Although some difficulties were experienced with the state concerning the level of detail in the nomination package, requiring a revision package to go forward, the state did accept our nomination in October. At the November luncheon, the incoming state president, SIR David Reiser, attended to induct our new Honorary Lifetime Member, SIR Nick DiMuccio. We all applaud his nomination and are honored by his service to the branch.

New Formats for the Rosters and Nuggets: Our Rosters and Nuggets have always been produced by commercial vendors. The final products in recent years have been very well accepted, but in the fall of 2008, Membership Chairman, SIR Jim Reifschneider, and Nugget Editor, SIR Ray Zelinski, worked with SIR Al Williams of Branch 3 to have him produce the Rosters and Nuggets with his own resources. The proposals result in not only potentially significant cost reductions, but considerable increase in quality and scope of the information that Al could include in the two products. The proposal was initially discussed in the October meeting, and approved in November. The December Nugget was the first newsletter produced in the new format, and the 2009 Rosters are being distributed in January, 2009.
