ATTENDANCE: Chairman Sir Dave Nemzek reported that the monthly meeting attendance averaged 57.3% during 2013. The most attended meeting was March, with 111 members attending, which was 68.1% of our total at that time. The least attended meeting was May, with 92 members, equal to 56.8%.

SUNSHINE: The Sunshine chairman, Sir Chris Christopherson, reported receiving numerous contacts regarding illnesses, hospitalizations, and the deaths of current and past members. Monthly reports were made in the õNuggetö and announced at monthly meetings. õGET WELLö cards were mailed to those that were ill and sympathy cards were mailed to the families of deceased members.

TRAVEL: As SIR Branch 23 did not have a travel chairman for 2013, we did not have organized luncheon presentations on travel opportunities. Our Nugget publisher, Al Williams, includes travel announcements from Branch 117 Travel Chairman, Bill Hale, and travel announcements for State SIR programs.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS: The following discussion highlights some of the significant events in 2013 for SIR Branch 23.

Status of Moving to a New Luncheon Location:

Significant effort was taken in 2011 to find a new location for our monthly luncheon, due to some difficulties dealing with the Elks Club. That investigation resulted in a decision by the Branch Executive Committee that, if we need to move, the best choice would be to move our luncheons to the Eskaton facility in Carmichael. However, Eskaton had planned some major facility renovations in 2012 that would have prevented them from accommodating us in their banquet room until the work was done. They hoped to have it done in time to have allowed us to move during 2012, but the work had not yet been completed. It was therefore decided that we would remain at the Elks Club for the time being. Although the general consensus is to continue with the planned move eventually, the Elks Club situation has improved. Although we still are offered only one entrée, there was no price increase for 2013, and we have been given access to a conference room for the Branch Executive Committee meetings. At the end of 2013, the decision to move is still pending situations at Eskaton, particularly parking concerns and some details issues have changed from the previous discussions, such as their decision not to provide bar service. A final decision on moving has been tabled for the time being, and that decision will not be made without a vote of the membership.

Summer Picnic: The summer picnic, first held in 2012, was again held in the May, 2013, and was very successful. It is currently planned to continue the picnic as a routine annual branch event.

Membership: Following several years of steady reduction in our total membership and attendance at the monthly luncheons, Big Sir Tom Novi established a Membership Survivability committee in 2014, consisting of himself, Ray Barsch, Carroll Hamon, Ray Zelinski, and Bill Sutherland. The committee had two main focuses. First was to emphasize recruitment of new members and the second was directed at improving the satisfaction and retention of the existing members.

The primary activity regarding recruitment was publicity and advertisement. Tom Novi contacted the Carmichael Times local newspaper to develop an article on SIR in general, and specifically regarding Branch 23. He had them also develop an advertisement for Branch 23 to run in the Carmichael Times over several months. The article ran in November, and the advertisement is still active. The committee, with assistance from Greg Hood, also developed a brochure to advertise our branch, with emphasis on our golf programs. The brochures were handed out at one of the Ancil Hoffman Menøs Club tournaments in October. As of the end of

2013, some phone calls have been received directly from these efforts and at least two men are expected to join in January 2014.

The satisfaction and retention issue focused on reviewing our branch activities to determine if there were changes or additions that would make our branch more attractive to new members and for better retention of existing members. In the summer, a list of potential activities was provided to the members to survey the level of interest in the existing activities and to identify potential new activities. Over 50% of the members responded to the survey, which did reveal significant interest in some new activities. The following actions have been taken as a result of the survey.

Sports Days: Greg Hood organized a trip to a SF Giants game in August. They had a full bus load of members and many of their wives, and had a really good time. Greg has scheduled another Giants trip for 2014. Greg has made reservations, all filled, for two Kings games in 2014, one in January and the other in March. Additional opportunities for attending sports activities in the area will be considered in the future.

Crab Feed: Significant interest was expressed in the survey for crab feeds. As a result, member Rich Battistessa, who is on the board of Dante Club, has arranged reservations for the branch to attend a crab feed at the Dante Club in January 2014. The reservations are being handled by Greg Hood.

Book Swap: We actually started a book swap at the luncheons, organized by Louis Espinoza, before the survey was held. There was reasonable interest shown in the survey, but based on the number of books currently available, it is obvious that the effort is doing well.

Bridge and Pinochle: We already have several branch members who participate in a multi-branch bridge group. However, as that is space limited, an effort was started to allow members to play bridge and pinochle at the Elks Club after the monthly luncheons. The bridge group is organized by Dave Nemzek and the pinochle group by Louis Espinoza. The turnout after the November luncheon was quite good, so hopefully this will become a routine monthly activity.
