ATTENDANCE: Chairman Sir Dave Nemzek reported that the monthly meeting attendance averaged 64.7% during 2014. The most attended meeting was February, with 118 members attending, which was 74.4% of our total at that time. The least attended meeting was September, with 92 members, equal to 58.6%.

SUNSHINE: The Sunshine chairman, Sir Chris Christopherson, reported receiving numerous contacts regarding illnesses, hospitalizations, and the deaths of current and past members. Monthly reports were made in the õNuggetö and announced at monthly meetings. õGET WELLö cards were mailed to those that were ill and sympathy cards were mailed to the families of deceased members.

TRAVEL: As SIR Branch 23 did not have a travel chairman for 2014, we did not have organized luncheon presentations on the more traditional travel opportunities, such as bus tours and cruises. However, as a result of the 2013 effort to increase activities for the branch, the Board has been coordinating specific travel activities for our members and families. Examples include Greg Hoodøs efforts to arrange group attendance at Giants and Kings games, and the tour of the underground areas of downtown Sacramento. These type activities will likely continue, with additional ideas such as a tour of Beale AFB, and a visit to the USS Hornet museum at Alameda.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: As a result of the activities survey conducted in 2013, the board has sanctioned and authorized further activities to benefit the members of Sir Branch 23. For 2014, these activities included the following:

Special Events: Board member, Greg Hood was the primary organizer for the following activities:

Giants Game: On July 30, a total of 58 SIR members and guests took a bus trip to the Giants game in San Francisco against the Pittsburgh Pirates. This was the second year for this very successful activity and it will be considered again for 2015 if the schedule and cost are favorable.

Kings Games: Kings tickets were purchased for games in January, March and November for 2014, and for a game in March 2015. Although the tickets were all eventually sold to the members, we are not likely to continue this activity in the future. The interest level is such as to make the tickets hard to sell, and the Kings organization is very difficult to deal with in making the reservations.

Underground Tour, Downtown Sacramento: On June 21, 20 SIRs members attended the ongoing tour program of the area of downtown Sacramento that was elevated in the mid-1800s for flood control purposes. The tour was a resounding success, and is planned again for 2015.

Dante Club Events: Primarily through Branch 23 member, Rich Battistessa, a member of the Dante Club board, we were given an opportunity to attend two Dante Club events during 2014, a crab feed in January and a wine tasting in May. Both events were well attended, and we look forward to similar opportunities in the future.

Annual Picnic: The picnic at Carmichael Park was held on May 20 for the third year, with a very good turnout. The food and cooking was all handled by Paul Joyce and his wife, Mary. In addition to the excellent food, Gary Bradley conducted a golf chipping contest, and Tom Novi ran a spirited bingo game. Everyone had a great time.

Horseshoes: Starting in May, the branch is now running horseshoe contests at the Elks Club after each luncheon. The event was set up by Bob Nielsen, and is steadily increasing in participation. Based on the monthly summary reports in the Nugget, the competition is very keen with some exciting finishes to the matches. The other members who participated were Ray Barsch, Carroll Hamon, David Leatherby, Jim Gigoux, David Page, and Billy Barnes.

Pinochle and Bridge: These activities, coordinated by Louie Espinoza for Pinochle and David Nemzek for Bridge, started in 2013, and are still available for members after each luncheon. The turnout has been inconsistent, and will hopeful pick up in future years.

Book Swap: Coordinated by Louis Espinoza, our book swap program at lunch continues with a large number of books available.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS: The following discussion highlights some of the significant events in 2014 for SIR Branch 23.

Status of Moving to a New Luncheon Location:

Significant effort was taken in 2011 to find a new location for our monthly luncheon, due to some difficulties dealing with the Elks Club. That investigation resulted in a decision by the Branch Executive Committee that, if we need to move, the best choice would be to move our

luncheons to the Eskaton facility in Carmichael. Since that time, further consideration for such a move has been deferred pending the status of some remodeling at Eskaton that would affect our move, plus the improvement of some of the situations at the Elks Club that were affecting us in 2011. Also, the issues of parking and no bar service at Eskaton remain to be dealt with in any potential change. Sir Branch 33 moved in the spring of 2014 to Eskaton from the Elks Club, and their experience will also be of interest in any future consideration of a move.

During 2014, the potential of moving to the Dante Club was again given consideration. One member of the relocation committee, Chris Christopherson, had a positive experience at the Dante Club, and proposed to the Branch Executive Committee that we reconsider moving to the Dante Club. A preliminary contract was obtained by the relocation committee and presented to the BEC in September. Although the terms of the contract contained some pros, and some cons that would have to be negotiated, it was unanimously disapproved for the same reason that existed in 2011 \acute{o} it imposes an unacceptable risk to membership retention. There are no plans for further consideration of the Dante Club as a luncheon site for our branch.

Membership: 2014 was a year of very significant activity for our membership program. We added 20 new members, plus added two members returning to active status from inactive. That was the biggest addition of active members since 2006 when we added 22 new members, and much higher that the average of 13 new members each year for the last 10 years. This boost, however, was offset by the largest loss of active members since 2008, the last year that such records are readily available. We lost 10 active members who passed away this year, which is the most in one year since 2005, and we lost seven members who resigned or were dropped, and 12 active members were converted to the inactive roles. The result is that we actually had a net loss of five members on the active roles, from 150 to 145. This shows how very important it is to continue to bring in new members, as our membership status is extremely vulnerable to reductions over which we have very little control.

Branch Finances: The Branch Executive Committee decided in November to increase the annual voluntary contribution from \$20 to \$25. This is the first increase in the annual contribution since January, 2002, when the \$20 contribution was implemented to replace the \$1 per month contribution that had existed for many years. As stated by Treasurer, Fritz Walgenbach, in the December 2014 newsletter, *the donation helps offset unfunded expenses such as lunch cost deficits, publishing the monthly newsletter, postage for some newsletters and State SIR dues. The primary need for the increase is that the meals are costing on the average \$15.50 each. Rather than raising the lunch costs to \$16, it was decided to raise the voluntary donation by \$5\!\text{\empty}
