### **OTHER ACTIVITIES:**

## **Special Events:**

**Giants Game:** Greg Hood coordinated a trip to the Giants / Dodger game on May 17. This is the fifth year that we have had this opportunity, and all the tickets were sold. There were 48 people on the trip, including members, spouses, and friends. The price per ticket was \$90, including the bus, the ticket for the game, and a \$12 food credit.

Alcatraz Tour: Greg Hood organized a trip on April 28 to tour Alcatraz Island. As a docent at Alcatraz, Greg was able to arrange for our tour to visit some locations within the prison and the island not normally available to public tours. The cost was \$33.75 per person, and 36 people attended.

**Dante Club Events:** Primarily through Branch 23 member, Rich Battistessa, a member of the Dante Club board, and in coordination with Tom Novi, we were given an opportunity to attend three Dante Club events that are available to the public. These included a cioppino dinner in April, a wine tasting in May, and a golf tournament and a River Cats game in August.

**Ladies Day Lunch:** For the 2<sup>nd</sup> year, the Ladies Day Lunch was again held at the Red Hawk Casino in Shingle Springs. It was held on December 13, with a total of 77 people attending. At a cost of \$20 per person, the event almost broke even, with a total income of \$1520, against expenses of \$1638. The event received very favorable remarks and it is likely to be rescheduled for 2018.

**Annual Picnic:** The picnic at Carmichael Park was held on May 23 for the sixth year, attended by 64 members, spouses and guests. The picnic was catered this year by Kentucky Fried Chicken with baked beans provided by Jim Monteverde. Gary Bradley conducted a golf chipping contest, and Tom Novi ran a spirited bingo game. The price was \$10 per person, which didnøt quite cover the total cost of \$775 against an income of \$624.

**Photo Contest:** Past Big Sir Dick Crippen, for the third year, has coordinated a branch photo contest; open to all branch members and their significant others. The contest included three categories: Portrait, Architecture, and Nature. Prizes were awarded to the top three in each category, based on a vote count of members at the August lunch. First place winners were Joe Sandhu, Rich Singer, and Paul Joyce. Others who won prizes included Paul Domyancic (3), Gopal Nemana, Greg Hood, and Maggie Suckow. The total cost for the event was \$210.

## **Book Exchange:**

Managed by Fred Lythgoe, this program is continuing in its fifth year, and is very popular. As we tend to receive more books than are being taken out, Fred deals with the excess books by giving some to the Bookworm, a used book store in Carmichael. This effort has resulted in our branch having an account with the Bookworm that allows any of our members to buy books at half price, with the other half taken from our account. By the end of the year, the account had a balance of approximately \$600. In addition, Fred coordinated a program with the Bookworm to allow the branch to purchase gift certificates at half price, with the other half taken from the account when the certificate is redeemed. The branch bought ten certificates to use as

door prizes in 2016, but the Bookworm decided to discontinue the gift card program in 2017, but will honor the gift cards that were previously issued.

At the end of the year, Fred experienced a problem with the Elks club that may affect the future of the book exchange program. They are likely not going to provide space in the hall for us to store our book inventory. It will be very disappointing to lose this popular program, but it will impractical to continue if the inventory cannot be stored on-site.

**Horseshoes:** Our horseshoe competitions have been discontinued due to a lack of participation.

**Bocce Ball:** David Peterson continued in his effort to create an active Bocce Ball competition after lunch using the Elks Club court. A work party did refurbish the court in 2016 and play was conducted at the end of that year, but the heavy rains in 2017 and lack of participation prevented any organized activity this year. It is still hoped that as more members learn about the sport and get involved, with additional work on the Elks court and a playing schedule set up after lunch in 2018. There are also discussions underway to possibly be able to use new courts that are planned to be constructed at the Dante Club.

**Inter-Branch Activities:** There are other activities that are conducted in coordination with other branches or opportunities that are made available through the state or individual branches. Some of these include:

**Travel:** We no longer maintain an active travel program in the branch. Travel opportunities are published in the Nugget each month and the state publication, Sir Happeningsø advertises for commercial tours and cruises, some of which are targeted specifically for SiR. In 2017 we were invited by SIR Branch 143 in Turlock to participate in a March trip to baseball spring training in Arizona. Also, we were invited to participate with other Sir branches in a June trip to the Canadian Rockies and a cruise of the British Isles in August.

**Bridge:** Several of the branch members participate in bridge groups that are combined with other local branches, and periodically will notify the membership through the Nugget when groups are expanding or need new members.

**Fishing:** Our participation in SiR fishing activities is available through two local inter-branch groups, <code>Jolly Hookersøin Rancho Cordova</code>, and <code>Wheels</code> and Reels, in Citrus Heights.

**OTHER SIGNIFICANT EVENTS:** The following discussion highlights some of the significant events in 2017 for SIR Branch 23.

**Membership and Recruiting.** Recruiting Chairman, Tom Novi, has routinely encouraged the members to bring in new members. For 2017 we added 21 new members, which included seven members transferring from SIR Branch 50 which has closed. Even without the benefit of the Branch 50 members, 2017 has been a good year regarding our membership status. Our total membership increased in 2017 despite the number of men who left or were deceased. Also, a decision was made in 2017 for the branch to provide funding to give a bottle of wine to the sponsor of each new member.
