GOLF:

General: Our branch participates with two separate groups; an 18-hole and a 9-hole group. All members are allowed to play in either or both groups. All of our tournaments are stroke play events, based on our own handicaps calculated using USGA principles.

9-Hole League: The chairman is Steve Ng. Steve was also the tournament director and statistician. The 9-hole league is made possible by the assistance of Wayne Hippenstiel, treasurer, George Hood, assistant tournament director and scheduler, and Bill Sutherland, handicapper. Also, Gary Bradley assisted Steve Ng by publishing the 9-hole information on the 18-hole league website. There were 23 scheduled tournaments, with three rainouts. The 9-holerøs awards luncheon was combined with the 18-hole leagueøs luncheon at the Cattlemenøs in Rancho Cordova, on December 6. The top ten point winners and the flight winners for each tournament are shown in the following tables. During the year, 52 members participated in the 9-hole golf league in a total of 457 rounds. OTHER ACTIVITIES:

Special Events:

Baseball Games: Due to the logistics issues with going to Giants or Aøs games, they were not scheduled for 2019. Tom Novi organized a trip to a Rivercats Game against the Tacoma Raniers on April 7. We were part of SIR Day at the Rivercats, where hundreds of Sirs from the area joined to celebrate the opening weekend of the season.

Ladies Day Lunch: For the 4th year, the Ladies Day Lunch was again held at the Red Hawk Casino in Shingle Springs. The chairman was Gordon Routsong. It was held on December 11, with a total of 71 people attending. The lunch cost \$1977.67, including \$1433.77 for lunch and \$543.77 for gifts. The members paid \$27 per person resulting in an income of \$1917.00

Annual Picnic: The picnic at Carmichael Park was held on May 14 for the 8th year, attended by 74 members, spouses and guests. The picnic was catered again this year by Kentucky Fried Chicken with baked beans provided by Ray and Carol Zelinski, and brownies by Gary Bradley. Rich Singer was the picnic Chairman, Gary Bradley conducted a golf chipping contest where the winner was given based on a practice shot, and Tom Novi again conducted bingo games with lots of prizes of wine and gift certificates at Lido Restaurant. The price was \$10 per person, the income was \$792, and the cost was \$799.73.

Book Exchange: The book exchange continued into its 7th year, managed by Jerry Westerman. The Elks Club has not restored any book storage capability, and Jerry continues to bring the books to each lunch in his car. Jerry has also expanded our membership with the Book Worm used book store to include their other location in Fair Oaks near the corner of Madison Avenue and Kenneth Avenue. This membership allows our members to purchase books at the Book Worm for half price. This program is very popular, and Jerry is to be commended for the logistics problems of dealing with the books each month.

Bocce Ball: Under the chairmanship of David Peterson, the bocce ball program settled in at the Dante Club. Although hampered by rain in the winter and spring, play was scheduled for twice per month during most of the year. Participation has been low, but improvement is likely as more members become aware of the sport and learn how to play. Evening events were added in the summer, and one special night was held including the wives and wine. The future looks bright for this program, including possible participation with other Sir Branches and state events.

Hiking Program: Activities Chairman, Gordon Callander, initiated a branch hiking program in the summer. With between 6 and 11 members, guests and spouses participating, the program included four hiking events: Ancil Hoffman Park, Lake Clementine Trail in the American River Canyon near Auburn, the Middle Fork of the American River, and William Land Park. These events have been very successful and enjoyable for the participating members.

Inter-Branch Activities: There are other activities that are conducted in coordination with other branches or opportunities that are made available through the state or individual branches. Some of these include:

Travel: We no longer maintain an active travel program in the branch. Travel opportunities are published in the Nugget each month and the state publication, *-*Sir Happeningsø advertises for commercial tours and cruises, some of which are targeted specifically for SiR.

Also, the travel chairman in SIR Branch 143 in Turlock routinely invites us to participate in travel cruises and baseball related trips.

Bridge: Several of the branch members participate in bridge groups that are combined with other local branches, and periodically will notify the membership through the Nugget when groups are expanding or need new members.

Fishing: Our participation in SiR fishing activities is available through two local inter-branch groups, *Holy Hookersøin Rancho Cordova, and Wheels and Reelsø, in Citrus Heights.*

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS: The following discussion highlights some of the significant events in 2019 for SIR Branch 23.

Dues versus Donations: About 6 years ago, the state Sir organization changed the financial rules to allow the branches to charge annual dues. In 2015, our branch considered making the change from a donation based financial program, but decided that our return rate was high enough that we would stay with donations. In 2019, as we learned that we were one of the last branches to make the change, and that it would make our financial program more equitable, it was decided that our annual donation allotment of \$25 would be considered mandatory dues.

Attendance Relief:

In 2018, State Rule 55 (now Policy 25) allowed the branches to grant attendance relief for situations due to prolonged illness, acting as a caregiver to a family member or companion, and extended absence from the Branch locale, or such other reason deemed valid by the Branch Executive Committee.

In 2019, Ray Zelinski and Carroll Hamon recommended procedures and guidelines for Branch 23 to use in implementing this policy for individual members. The BEC approved that the granting action shall be initiated by request from the member or a close family member. The approval, if granted by Branch 23, shall: a) be in written form; b) signed by the Big SIR, c) stipulate a time duration, d) discuss a luncheon and activity participation allowance, if any, and e) remind the member that he is still expected to support Branch 23 by paying the annual dues.

Lunch Issues at the Elks Club:

In 2017 and 2018, we experienced problems at the Elks Club regarding table space and penalty charges for unused meals and extra place settings. In 2018, Elks Club agreed to provide enough settings for 136 people, including 13 tables and the head table, which was more than our normal attendance, but did provide a solution to our issue of members being able to sit with specific people at lunch. We increased our lunch charge in 2019 from \$17 to \$19 to hopefully cover the cost of free lunches and any additional charges above the meal cost. Also, in 2018, we instituted an email notification system to remind members each month to notify the attendance chairman if they could not attend the meeting. This process had a positive effect on reducing unexcused absences and in providing Elks with the estimated attendance.

The effect of these actions had a positive impact for 2019. From a cost perspective, our income from the lunch fee almost matched the total Elks charge. Our income for the year was \$21,522.00, and the total charge was \$21,499.00. The Elks Club charge included the cost of 53 free lunches and \$368 of additional charges, mainly for the bar license.

Our treasurer, Jim Coe estimated that if the Elks Club included all of the charges for table cloths and unused settings allowed in the contract that our cost would have been increased by \$860. However, overall for the branch, our total annual expenses were about \$1500 less than our

dues income. We could therefore easily have covered those additional charges, and, given that the lunch cost did include the 53 free lunches, the financial outlook for 2020 is quite positive.

Haggin Oaks Golf Expo: For three days, Apr 26 ó 28, our branch participated with Branch 49 in manning a recruiting booth at the Haggin Oaks Golf Expo. Our team was led by Big Sir Phil Sittner, and included Gordon Routsong, Roger Riley, John Boss, Gordon Callander, and Tom Novi. The team was particularly grateful to Robert Epplet of Folsom Branch 49 for sharing the booth space. Unfortunately, Robert died of pancreatic cancer near the end of 2019. It is also important to note that Haggin Oaks did not charge us for the booth, and the effort is expected to continue in the future. Two new members, Dell Fystrom and Dennis Shimek eventually became members through this project.

50th Anniversary Dinner:

Branch 23 received its charter from the state Sir organization in October, 1969. To commemorate this historical milestone, an anniversary dinner was held on September 19, 2019 at the Northridge Country Club.

Big Sir Phil Sittner hosted the dinner, which was attended by the State President, Ed Benson, Regional Director, Mark Stuart, and Area Governor, Giorgio Dina. We were serenaded by the Sir Country Club Aires, and entertained with a very interesting historically based video. Historian Bill Sutherland presented a talk about our branch history, Cass Mastalski, our 18-hole golf chairman discussed our 50 years of golf, and our Activities Chairman and Past Big Sir Greg Hood summarized our activities history.

The dinner was organized by Ray Zelinski, Tom Novi, and John Boss, with approximately 80 members and guests in attendance. Financially, the dinner about broke even with an income of \$2840 and total expenses of \$2831.86. For the record, the narratives that were prepared to support the history and golf presentations are attached as appendices.
