2019 is the 50th anniversary year for Branch 23. Our historian, Bill Sutherland, will be submitting articles to the Branch 23 Nugget during the 2019 calendar year. (Ed.)

2019 – 50th Anniversary Year for SIR Branch 23

The idea of Sons in Retirement was conceived by four retired friends during lunch at the Clarimar Restaurant in San Mateo, California, on July 23, 1958. They met again a month later, with 14 additional retired friends,

where they created the basic guidelines for the organization that was incorporated in 1959. The second Sir branch was created in 1960 in Richmond. Their lunch site was Spenger's Fish Grotto in Berkeley (that'd be cool). In 1960, Branch 3, the Camellia Branch in Sacramento was created, having their lunches at the Elks Club, now on Riverside Blvd. Over the next 7 years, 19 more branches were created in Northern California.

In late 1968, Branch 3 in Sacramento decided to sponsor a new branch as they had more applications than they could accommodate. Sir Branch 23 was conceived. The first meeting of Branch 23 was in February, 1969, at the El Dorado Hotel on Canterbury Road and old Highway 40. There were 24 men in attendance, including officers from Branch 3 and Branch 14, where they appointed interim officers and set goals for the eventual receipt of a charter from the Sir organization. (We still have the original handwritten minutes of that first meeting.)

The first newsletter, not yet named the Nugget, was published in June, 1969, and the membership had reached 51. Our state charter was approved in September 1969. Branch 23 received the charter on October 14, with the lunch site having moved to the Dante Club. There were 129 charter members. (We have the original list.)

Our official anniversary date is September 8, and the Branch Executive Committee has already established a committee to plan and organize a specific celebration of our 50th anniversary later this year. In the meantime, I intend to include occasional Nugget articles concerning our branch history. If anyone has any questions about our history, please let me know, and I will research our documentation for possible answers.
