June's guest speaker was to have been Topo Padilla, the son and partner of Greg Padilla, co-owners of Greg Padilla Bail Bonds. I had invited Topo in hopes that we learn more regarding the California passing of SB10 which goes into effect November of this year. The Legislature's passing and Governor Brown's signing of SB10 will do away with "cash bails", along with the bonding companies. The responsibility for arrested citizens let out of jail during the period between arrest and trial will be turned over to the judges and most likely a new bureaucracy. The Criminal Justice System will wait the outcome. Branch 23 thanks Greg Padilla for stepping in for Topo.

Our Guest Speaker for July will be Chaplain Mindi Russell, Executive Director and Senior Chaplain of the Law Enforcement Chaplaincy-Sacramento (LECS). The LECS is a non-profit which began in 1977 to provide a rapid response by attending to post-trauma reactions to events for police, victims, and the community at large. They can be on scene 24-7-365 throughout all of Sacramento County. The LECS serves 15 different law enforcement agencies and 16 school districts. The LECS has been named the National Model Chaplaincy.
