Branch Golf History:

Sir Branch 23 will be celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2019. Since the beginning, the golf program has been a hallmark activity of the branch, but details of the extent of its activity are very limited. We do know that through the 1990's and into this century the participation in both leagues was greater than it is today. Some old-timers can remember many 18 hole tournaments with over 100 players.

It is unfortunate that we lack the historical records of past participation, as many of the older members, some still active in the branch but no longer able to compete, would enjoy seeing those statistics. However, since our golf leagues incorporated the use of commercial software for tournament management and handicapping in 2005, we do have accurate records of our golf participation in these last 14 seasons. As we move into our 50th anniversary season, this column will periodically include some golf history, starting with individual participation leaders since 2005.

Overall, the current members who have played in the most tournaments combining both leagues are **Frank Abel** and **Cass Mastalski**, both with 467 tournaments. The most events played in the 18 hole league belong to **Joe Rodriguez** with 288; the most played in the 9 hole league is **Christopherson** with 193. It is significant to note that the most events played in the 9 hole league since 2005 was 207 by **Russ Korhonen**, who passed away this spring. The top ten current players in each category are as follows: Note that these statistics are based on the number of scores entered into the handicap program. They do not include rounds played in the team events like shambles and scrambles in the 18 hole league, nor rounds that the player does not finish.
